



Are you a natural resource/wildlife major who would like to gain some great experience working with wildlife and habitat management? If so, consider spending your summer on the prairie of northeastern North Dakota! The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, National Wildlife Refuge System in Devils Lake is in the process of recruiting individuals for the 2009 field season.

The Devils Lake Wetland Management District Complex is located in the center of the Prairie Pothole Region of the Northern Great Plains. Hundreds of thousands of waterfowl, colonial and wading wetland birds, shorebirds, and passerines use the wetlands and grasslands that are managed and protected within the Complex boundaries. We manage and protect more than 200,000 acres of land, including Waterfowl Production Areas, Kellys Slough National Wildlife Refuge, Lake Alice National Wildlife Refuge, Sullys Hill National Game Preserve, Easement National Wildlife Refuges, and wetland/grassland Easements.

The vacancy announcements for seasonal positions in Devils Lake are open from around **December 29 - January 16**. If you want to apply for positions, you must fill out the online questionnaire and submit your resume on www.usajobs.gov. The job announcement numbers are **R6-09-226935-D** (Biological Aid), **R6-09-226936-D** (Biological Science Technician), and **R6-09226937-D** (Biological Science Technician [Wildlife]).

Make sure you provide all of the necessary documentation to support your qualifications; for example, if you are using coursework as part of your qualifications, make sure to include transcripts. Review the application procedures on the website to ensure that you do provide the necessary documentation.
