



RRWMB COMMUNICATIONS INTERN

Application Deadline: February 15, 2009

The Red River Watershed Management Board (RRWMB) and its affiliated watershed districts invites applications for a COMMUNICATIONS INTERN to assist the RRWMB Public Information Officer, Administrator, and River Monitoring Staff.

The internship begins in March 2009 and ends February 15, 2010. Degree-seeking college credit of no more than 6 credits is required of all applicants.

The internship is open to all junior or senior level college or university students enrolled in academic programs related to Natural Resources Management, Journalism, Broadcasting, Communication, Marketing, and Public Relations. Minimum GPA: 3.0.

The RRWMB Communications intern will receive up to 6 college credits and \$400/month compensation for 10 hours of work per week over a 10 month (January-November) period and any travel expenses.

The RRWMB Communications intern must provide their own computer with MS Word 2003 and internet access, possess a valid driver's license and cell phone, and be able to travel to monthly RRWMB meetings.

The RRWMB Communications intern will assist the public information officer in designing and coordinating public affairs initiatives, including: the development of press and media kits, assisting in event and conference planning, creation and distribution of press releases, designing and coordinating press conferences, networking with county, state, and federal officials, facilitation of watershed Citizen Advisory Boards, and establishing and nurturing media relations.
